

Summary

Theodore "Teddy" Hartigan is the scion of a wealthy Washington, D.C. family, settled into a comfortable job at the State Department and a placid diplomat's career. Then in 1938, as Hitler's inexorable rise continues, he is assigned to the US Consulate in Amsterdam.

Teddy's job is to process visa applications, and by 1939, refugees from Nazi-conquered Poland, Austria, and other countries are desperate to secure safe passage to America. As Hitler sweeps through France, Belgium, Luxembourg, Denmark, and Holland, the screws tighten and law after virulent law is passed to threaten the lives of Jews. When Teddy and his girlfriend Sara are introduced to an orphaned girl named Katy, who has been abandoned on the grounds of a nursery school, they agree to adopt her. But Teddy realizes that he holds the key to saving lives, whether five, fifty, or five hundred—and makes the dangerous decision to join with underground groups and use his position at the Consulate to rescue those with no other avenue of escape.





Summary

1983: At a former sanatorium in the north of Iceland, now a hospital ward, an old nurse, Yrsa, is found murdered. He is also a collector of golden age detective stories, and is writing his thesis on the 1983 murders in the north. As Helgi delves deeper into the past, and starts his new job, he decides to try to meet with the original suspects. But soon he finds silence and suspicion at every turn, as he tries to finally solve the mystery from years before.

And how is the issing Sonoko continuing to stay one step ahead of the police searching for her?

It's up to Detective Galileo to find the nearly hidden threads of history and coincidence that connect the people around the bloody murder-which, surprisingly, connect to his own traumatic past—to unravel not merely the facts of the crime but the helix that ties them all together.





Cold Crematorium

Reporting from the Land of Auschwitz

József Debreczeni, Paul Olchváry, Jonathan Freedland

Now in paperback, the first English language edition of a lost memoir by a Holocaust survivor, offering a shocking and deeply moving perspective on life within the camps.

Summary

József Debreczeni, a prolific Hungarian-language journalist and poet, arrived in Auschwitz in 1944. He spent twelve horrifying months of incarceration and slave labor in a series of camps, ending in the "Cold Crematorium", the so-called hospital of the forced labor camp Dörnhau, where prisoners too weak to work awaited execution. But as Soviet and Allied troops closed in, local Nazi commanders—anxious about the possible consequences of outright murder—decided to leave the remaining prisoners to die in droves rather than sending them directly to the gas chambers.

Debreczeni recorded his experiences in *Cold Crematorium*, one of the harshest, most merciless indictments of Nazism ever written. This haunting memoir, rendered in the precise and unsentimental style of an accomplished journalist, is an eyewitness account of incomparable literary quality. The subject matter is intrinsically tragic, yet the author's evocative prose, sometimes using irony, sarcasm, and even acerbic humor, compels the reader to imagine human beings in circumstances impossible to comprehend intellectually.

First published in Hungarian in 1950, it was never translated into a world language due to McCarthyism, Cold War hostilities and antisemitism. This masterpiece that was nearly lost to time is now available in 15 languages, finally taking its rightful place among the greatest works of Holocaust literature.

Contributor Bio

József Debreczeni was a Hungarian-language novelist, poet, and journalist who spent most of his life in Yugoslavia. On May 1, 1944, he was deported to Auschwitz after three years as a forced laborer. He was later a contributor to the Hungarian media in the Yugoslav region of Vojvodina, as well as leading Belgrade newspapers. He was awarded the *Híd Prize*, the highest distinction in Hungarian literature in the former Yugoslavia.





Born in Augusta, Georgia, to Black Catholic parents, Raquel spent years feeling isolated, even within a loving, close-knit family. Within just a few short years of community organizing in Atlanta, Oakland, and New York, Raquel emerged as one of the most formidable Black trans activists in history.

In *The Risk It Takes to Bloom*, Raquel Willis recounts the possibility of transformation after tragedy, and how complex moments can push us all to take necessary risks and bloom toward collective liberation.
